Jim Crunk reported that he has contacted a speaker from Virginia Tech for next year's program.

Then George presented our Speaker, Ric Reichard, the President of the Master Naturalists of the ESVA. Mr. Reichard lives in Chincoteaque near our BGES member Bettina Dembeck. He provided us with a wealth of interesting information. To begin with there are 150 active members of the MN on the Shore. The organization has 26 chapters in the State of Virginia. Our chapter started 12 years ago. Many state agencies sponsor the Program. Each Year MN offers a 10 week basic training with classroom and outside activities. Upon successful completion, an additional 8 hours of advanced training are required and 400 hours of volunteer service approved by the Board. The Eastern Shore Natural Area Preserves are: Wreck Island, Mutton Hunk Fen, Savage Neck Dunes, Parker's Marsh, Pickett's Harbor, Cape Charles Coastal Habitat, Magothy Bay, Parramore Island. The MN contribute by providing education, outreach and service dedicated to the beneficial management of the natural resources .within the ES communities.
